I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves. Be on your guard against men; they will hand you over to the local councils and flog you in their synagogues. On my account you will be brought before governors and kings as witnesses to them and to the Gentiles. But when they arrest you, do not worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time you will be given what to say, for it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you.

"Brother will betray brother to death, and father his child; children will rebel against their parents and have them put to death. All men will hate you because of me, but he who stands firm to the end will be saved. When you are persecuted in one place, flee to another. I tell you the truth, you will not finish going through the cities of Israel, you will not finish going through the cities of Israel before the Son of Man comes.

"A student is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master. It is enough for the student to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If the head of the house has been called Beelzebub, how much more the members of his household!

"So do not be afraid of them. There is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known. What I tell you in the dark, speak in the daylight; what is whispered in your ear, proclaim from the roofs. Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from the will of your Father. And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.

"Whoever acknowledges me before men, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in heaven. But whoever disowns me before men, I will disown him before my Father in heaven.

"Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to turn

"Anyone who loves his father of mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves his son or daughter more than me is not worth of me; and anyone who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

He was so mad he should have had a heart attack. He could hardly get his words out before he kicked me out of his house. What got him going? I told him that he, like we, that he was a sinner. He got so mad he should have had a heart attack. Another time, another place, another face. Another face as red as a face can get. Why? I told him that he sinned. "No, I don't. I don't sin any more." I don't know that I've ever seen a face get redder.

I don't seem to have as many people angry at me, angry for calling them out. Oh, I have people upset with me for not dancing their dance. I have people disappointed in me for not being the pastor they want or need. But I don't have as many people red in the face stammering angry because I called them out on their sin.

Part of me says that's a good thing. I sleep better at night when the world's not angry at me. A different part of me knows better. Like a blister that won't heal, like a thorn in the flesh, like a sharp stone inside my shoe, I keep hearing the voices: "You need to have that talk." Whose voice is that? Mostly, it's the voice of God.

I imagine most all of you hear that same voice, don't you? Dads and moms, your little baby is growing up, your little baby is all grown up, and what is she doing that you all know is wrong? What is he not doing that you all know he should be doing? Or your dear, dear friend - maybe that friend you used to get in trouble with - that dear, dear friend is still getting in trouble pretending it's alright with God. Or maybe that brother, sister, son, daughter, friend isn't really in trouble, but worse. They're good people - but damned. They're living damned because they're living without Jesus; they're living damned because they're holding on to their sin instead of holding on to their Savior. And, please, don't tell yourself that they can do both. You know better than to think people can hold on to sin and Jesus at the same time. So you hear the voices: "You need to have that talk."

And part of us doesn't want to have that talk because ... what? We don't want to get someone upset? We don't want to make things worse? We don't want to be shown up because we don't have the answer for all their excuses, questions, arguments? Or maybe we don't want to have that talk because just the thought of that talk makes us feel guilty? We don't want to have that talk, but we keep on hearing the voices: "You need to have that talk."

Jeremiah was tired of having those talks. He was tired of people being angry with him, tired of people arguing, tired of seeing people and things go from bad to worse, tired of feeling small and not good enough. And it wasn't just the talks.

For Jeremiah it wasn't just the talks. It was feeling left out and alone. When the guys got together, when the neighbors got together, Jeremiah wouldn't. Jeremiah couldn't. He wouldn't get together in their sin. He couldn't, he wouldn't get together and pretend that everything was alright, when it wasn't. And it hurt.

Jeremiah hurt. So what did he do? He took it out on God. "LORD, you know how much I love you and your word - 'LORD, when your words came, I ate them they were my joy and my heart's delight." "Lord, you know how much I've given up for you - friends, family, good times." "Lord, you know what I've done for you; you know what I've given up for you. Why does life have to be so hard? Why don't you do something? Why aren't you there for me, God?"

I suppose blaming God is one way to answer his call to step up and speak up. Another way to answer his call is what? Excuses. "It's not the right time to say something. I'm not the right one to say something. I don't know what to say." "He's confirmed now. She's in college; she has her own place." "They have made it clear they won't listen." All those things could be true. It might be the wrong time; you might be the wrong one; you might not know what to say; they might not listen. All that might be true, but if that's where you leave it - for all your family, for all your friends - is it a reason, or an excuse?

What did the LORD say to Jeremiah? Or first, what would you like the LORD to say to Jeremiah? Perhaps: "Relax. Don't worry about it. I know; it's hard; it hurts, doesn't it?" But that's not what the LORD said, is it? Instead of holding Jeremiah's hand, instead of patting Jeremiah on the back, first the LORD gave Jeremiah a kick in the backside. "This is what the LORD says: 'If you repent, I will restore you that you may serve me; if you utter worthy, not worthless, words, you will be my spokesman. Let this people turn to you, but you must not turn to them."

Someplace Jeremiah turned. Someplace Jeremiah joined the world against God. Instead of speaking up for God, he spoke against God. Instead of speaking up for God, he was keeping quiet. And so, instead of standing true with God, he was on the edge of fitting in with the world - no good to God and no good to anyone else.

So the LORD called him out. And the LORD calls us out. He calls us out for our complaining, he calls us out for our excuses, he calls us out for keeping quiet when people need us to be speaking up; and when we sound more like the world than like God, he calls us out - "Repent."

And then he puts his arms around us - the same arms he put around you at your baptism when he said: "I've got you; you're mine." He puts his arms around you - the same arms he stretched out on the cross with our sin and guilt, our excuses and procrastination. He puts his arms around you - the same arms he stretches out to you in his Supper: "take eat, take drink, given and shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins." He puts his arms around us, and he says: "I know; it's hard. I know; it hurts."

And then he says something more, the same something more that kept Jeremiah going, the same something more that made Jeremiah strong: "I will make you a wall to this people, a fortified wall of bronze; they will fight against you but will not overcome you, for I am with you to rescue and save you," declares the LORD. "I will save you from the hands of the wicked and redeem you from the grasp of the cruel."

It's easy to imagine angry faces, angry words. It's not always so easy to imagine God wrapping his arms around us: "I've got you. I'll give you the words you need." It's easy to imagine people ignoring us, turning away. It's not so easy to imagine people listening to God and turning back to him. But that is what God has been doing since Satan spoke up in the Garden of Eden. God has been turning hearts - hurting hearts, angry hearts, blaming hearts, excuse-making hearts, godless hearts, stubborn hearts, fighting hearts - God has been turning hearts back to him. In Bible Class we'll put some names on those hearts. But now, let me say - for almost as long as there have been hurting, angry, blaming, excuse-making, godless, stubborn, fighting hearts, God has been winning those hearts back to him so he can stretch his arms out around them: "I've got you; I forgive you; you're mine."

How? He could use angels. He could do what he did for Adam and Eve or for Saul who became Paul; he could come and call us back in person. Instead, he uses people like Jeremiah, people who struggle, people who feel too weak and too small, people who get tired, people who sometimes wonder if it's all worth it. He uses people like you and like me to say what needs to be said. "Lord, God, soften our hard hearts, strengthen our weak hearts, give us your love and wisdom, to say what needs to be said so people can know your Love and Truth, for your glory and the good of your people. Amen."
