Sermon followed by Service

January 30, 2022

Luke 4:38-44

You've been there, haven't you? You're going down the steps into the cellar, you take a sniff - musty, stale. If you were spelunking in a cave, it would be the smell of an adventure. But in the cellar, it's more like a smell of death, a stale mustiness working its way through everything down in that dank darkness. You've sniffed it, even tasted it - haven't you? - stale mustiness?

What does that have to do with our lesson? Nothing, well, almost nothing. In our lesson we don't taste or even smell stale mustiness, we see mustness, the mustness of Jesus.

What do I mean by the mustness of Jesus? Look and listen to Jesus in our lesson. It's early in his ministry. At the beginning of the chapter, Jesus follows the Holy Spirit's lead and goes out into the wilderness to do battle with Satan. He's focused on what God gave him to do; he doesn't let Satan distract him with comfort and convenience; he doesn't let Stan distract him with the good life, the easy life, the me-life. No, Jesus is here to do what God gives him to do - and he puts Satan in his place. Then Jesus heads north to Galilee; he goes to Nazareth where he grew up. Again, we see the mustness of Jesus - on the Sabbath he goes to the synagogue as was his custom. To gather with the people of God to hear and share the Word of God - that was a must. Even when the people didn't want to hear what Jesus had to say. In Nazareth, they try to chase Jesus off and throw him off the cliff, but Jesus just walks on through. He couldn't be stopped; he

wouldn't be stopped. Here, there, he kept on preaching and teaching. And the people were amazed at the authority of his teaching - there is a mustness in his Word.

What mustness do you hear in the word of Jesus?

On the day of our lesson, Jesus is in the synagogue preaching, teaching, living the life. What life? Not the life of the world, but living the life of God, doing what God gave him to do. After teaching in the synagogue, after casting out an evil spirit and amazing the people with the mustness of his word - "even the evil spirits have to obey him" - Jesus goes to Simon Peter's house.

Peter's mother-in-law has a high fever. With the mustness of his Word, Jesus rebukes the fever and it leaves. And Peter's mother-in-law - now there is a mustness in her. She gets up and just has to do for Jesus and the others.

How have you been blessed by Jesus' mustness for you?

How has Jesus' mustness for you worked in you a mustness for Jesus?

How does your mustness for Jesus show in your life?

After that, what are we told? "When the sun was setting, the people brought to Jesus all who had various kinds of sickness, and laying his hands on each one, he healed them. Moreover, demons came out of many people, shouting, 'You are the Son of God!' But he rebuked them and would not allow them to speak, because they knew he was the Christ." It could have been, it should have been time for Jesus to sit back and relax. But his preaching, his teaching, his work was paying off - people were coming to him for help. So with a mustness, Jesus did what he was here to do - he showed the love of his

Father and healed the sick. With a mustness, Jesus did what he came to do - he put Satan in his place and cast out Satan's demons.

Did you notice? Did you notice this about Jesus' mustness? His patience, his heart for people? Sometimes when we're feeling a mustness - "I've got people to see and things to do." Sometimes when we're feeling a mustness - "We need to get this right." Sometimes when we're feeling a mustness, we steer into the fast lane with a drive that turns brisk and brusque with a bite, that morphs from shepherd of sheep to driver of cattle. Did you notice Jesus' patience, his heart for people? Jesus didn't settle for convenience or efficiency; he reached out and touched each one; he reached out and laid his hands on each one to heal them. He didn't just have a mustness to get things done; he has a mustness to personally, carefully love each and every one of us.

When our mustness for Jesus turns brisk and brusque and with a bite, when our mustness for Jesus morphs from shepherd to sheep to driver of cattle - what does the love of Jesus invite and compel us to do?

The next morning, he didn't sleep in. He had a mustness about his day. He got up before bright and early and went off alone to pray. Peter, the disciples, and more, hunted Jesus down. They wanted Jesus to stay. Sounds like a win, doesn't it? After being chased out of Nazareth, being chased down to stay in Capernaum must have been a welcome change. But Jesus had a restless mustness inside him. He couldn't stay put: "I must preach the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent." "I must" ... not just do good things, not just do right things, not just do easy things, not just do what people want. "I must preach the good

news to others too, because that is why I was sent." It's easy to get caught up in doing nice things, good things, right things, and to let ourselves slide on why we are here - to share the Good News of the kingdom. Jesus didn't let his mustness slide. Jesus didn't let his mustness get put off to the side. Jesus kept his mustness alive - "I must preach the good news of the kingdom to others also."

How's your mustness? Have you been a Christian so long that your mustness is getting musty and stale? Have you let COVID coop you up or wear you down so your mustness for God is slipping or sliding? It's easy to feel worn down and cooped up and let COVID be an excuse ... because we all know that you can catch COVID from making a phone call or sending a note to check in on someone you haven't seen in a while, right? It's easy to put our mustness for Jesus off to the side, even on the slide, so we can rest and recuperate, but we want to watch out. It's easy to rest with the world and forget to recharge with Jesus. It's easy to let our mustness for Jesus turn musty and stale. Sometimes musty and stale can be refreshed and renewed. But sometimes people let musty and stale get so set in themselves that what are they good for? Nothing but the burning pit of hell.

What is the difference between resting with the world and recharging with Jesus?

Thank God for Jesus' mustness. When you think of Jesus saying "must," what comes to mind? The "must" of the cross. "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected ... that he must be killed and after three days rise again." Jesus had a mustness in him, a must to love God, a must to love you, a must that he couldn't put off to the slide, a must that he wouldn't let slide, a must he took all the way to the cross. On the way to the cross, what did he do? He took the

musts that we've put off to side, the musts we've let slide; he's taken our mustiness and staleness. He took it all as his own and was cursed and crushed and tossed out as though he were musty and stale. Now, with Jesus, God calls you forgiven, and he sees you with mustness, not mustiness; he sees you with the mustness of Jesus. And by his Spirit, he refreshes and renews us to live like Jesus - to live the life God has for us.

About a month ago we began this new year at the baptism font. Baptized, we get to live a new life with God. Baptized, we get to live a life of new starts together with God. So, do you sense a staleness, a mustiness in your life with God? Let's make this year a year of new starts. Look to Jesus, refresh, renew, and live with the mustness of Jesus - "I have a life to live with God!" Amen.

How are you using your baptism to live a life of new starts this year?

What is the biggest challenge to living a life of new starts? What may be a solution for those challenges?

In what ways has your mustness for Jesus become musty?

In what ways has our St. John mustness for Jesus become musty?

Seeing our mustiness and seeing Jesus' mustness, what do we do?

What does Jesus do? Then what? Now what?

Silence for meditation and reflection



They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.



Amen.


LORD'S PRAYER


