December 26, 2021

Luke 1:67-79

What did you get for Christmas? Did you know before you got it? Did you shake it, thump it, sneak a peek? Zechariah knew what he was getting. He didn't do any shaking, thumping, or sneaking a peek; but he knew. And what Zechariah was getting for Christmas had him fired up!

How so? For the past nine months before our lesson, Zechariah had been mute; he couldn't talk, couldn't say a world. Can you imagine how frustrating that would be? Worse, for the past who knows how many years, Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth were childless; the pain and disappointment would have been so heavy. But now Zechariah has a new baby in the house, his first-born. Can you imagine how fired up, how proud he must be? After nine months of not being able to say a word, now Zechariah can talk. And what does he say? What's the first thing out of his mouth? Not "I can talk again!" Not "Look at my baby!" But "Praise be to God; I've got Jesus!" Even before Zechariah saw him, even before Jesus was born: "Praise be to God; I've got Jesus!" Better than getting his voice back. Better than having a new baby boy. "Praise be to God; I've got Jesus!"

Puts me to shame. Ask me what I got for Christmas and so often the first things I think of are cards and cookies, gift cards and candy, cash and checks. And for all those things: "Praise be to God! God is so good!" But the best Christmas gift I've ever received ... not always so quick to remember. What helps you keep perspective? What helps you remember Christmas is nothing without Christ?

Why? Put yourself in Zechariah's place. Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth have their hearts with God. Yet their hearts hurt. As children of Abraham they look around at their country in shame: "This isn't the way it's supposed to be." The line of great King David was but a rotting stump. Instead, the glory of the land was the work of fake-Jew Herod the Great, a paranoid tyrant bullying, terrorizing his people. Looking around at those people, Zechariah and Elizabeth would have felt shame and fear - "This isn't the way it's supposed to be." Looking around, they would have seen their neighbors on the losing end of a culture war. The Jewish way of life was under attack; God's way of life was under attack. "You've got to fit in with the world. If you want to be successful, you won't find success in following God. If you want to be somebody ... if you want to get somewhere, you've got to fit in with the world." Even in the church - Zechariah was a priest;

he got to serve in the Temple - even in the church Zechariah would have felt shame - "This isn't the way it's supposed to be." The priesthood had become corrupt, politically corrupt with bribery and assassination, religiously corrupt with priests who cared more about power and prestige than truth and love; put it together, they cared more about self than about God. As a man of God, Zechariah would have hurt: "This isn't the way it's supposed to be."

Where do you see: "This isn't the way it's supposed to be"?

As a man of God, a man whose heart was right with God, Zechariah wouldn't have been pointing fingers just out at the world around him. He would have hurt over the corruption in his own heart, the ways he fit in with the world instead of walking with God. Zechariah knew getting his voice back wouldn't fix that. Finally having a child, a son, wouldn't fix that. "Praise be to God! Jesus was coming!"

Do you see yourself with Zechariah and Elizabeth? Look around at our world - in the news, on TV, in music, and video games - what does the world think of God's life and love? Look at our church - for some, always more talk than walk - for all of us, can any of us we say we're living up to what we're supposed to be? As people whose hearts are with God, we know "This isn't the way it's supposed to be! We aren't the way we're supposed to be."

All the Christmas stuff ... the microscope I begged for, the train cars I wowed over, the orange robot we fought for, the money we long for ... all that stuff didn't, doesn't, don't, and won't fix that. None of the stuff of this world can.

What stuff of this world do we use to try to make our life right?

Zechariah knew what could, would, can, and does make life right. He saw Jesus coming to set his people free - free from Herod, free from corruption in the church, free from slavery to society ("you better fit in or else"); even better, Zechariah saw Jesus coming to set his people free, free from guilt, free from God's judgment.

Zechariah saw: God had set Christmas in motion; and not just Christmas, but Good Friday and Easter, Judgment Day and Heaven's Homecoming Day - God had set them all in motion - and nothing could or would stop them. Already Zechariah saw Jesus' work as good as done. Herod, more Herods, and Pilate couldn't stop Jesus. The Pharisees and Sadducees, the chief priests and teachers of the law couldn't stop Jesus. All the tempting of the world, all the bullying, all the peer pressure of the world couldn't stop Jesus.

As God's True Priest, Jesus would offer himself as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. As God's True King, Jesus would put sin and Satan where they belong - out. As God's True Prophet, Jesus would bring God's promise - peace! And he did!

We don't always see that, do we? Around us, even inside us - it's still not the way it's supposed to be; we're not the way we're supposed to be. But already with Jesus you have treasures you just can't find under a Christmas tree. With Jesus, you are loved even on your worst of days. With Jesus you are somebody; no matter what other people think of you, you are precious and powerful in the family of God. With Jesus, even when your world is upside down, you have God and his angels looking out for you. With Jesus, no matter what the economy does, no matter what COVID does, you have a better future coming - you have heaven coming! Not only has God put it in motion - we get to think like Zechariah - it's as good as done! Just last month we heard Paul tell us: "There is nothing in all creation that can separate you from the love of God in Christ Jesus."

What does that mean for us? Zechariah would say: "Peace and freedom!" You hear it in Zechariah's song: "I've got Jesus. I'm redeemed; I'm released! I'm free!" Free for what? "Free to go my own way"? No, that wasn't it, was it? That's not what Zechariah said. We're not free to be free from God; we're free to be free with God! How did Zechariah put it? We are free "**to serve him without fear in holiness and righteousness before him all our days**." Zechariah had seen God's holy angel; Zechariah knew fear in the face of God's holiness. Now, with Jesus, we get to stand before God without fear. We get to walk with God, talk with God, work with God - not with some "have to" hanging over us, not with some "you better get it right" hanging over us. We get to walk and talk and work with God - without fear.

Without fear, we get to walk and talk like Jesus, without fear of what the world thinks. Without fear, we get to be kind and gentle like Jesus, without fear of being taken advantage of. Without fear, we get to be generous giving like Jesus, without fear of not having enough. Without fear, we get to raise our children as God's children, we get to serve God's family, without some FOMO fear that we're going to miss out on something better from this world. Without fear, we get to live differently than the rest of the world; we get to live life the way it is supposed to be

- our heart in God's heart, God's heart in our heart. In other words, we get to live in peace! Why? "Praise be to God! We've got Jesus!" Amen.
