Sermon followed by Service

April 3, 2022

1 Timothy 1

"God, I thank you that I believe in creation, that you created the world in six days. God, I thank you that I believe in the power of baptism, and your gift of forgiveness and peace in the Lord's Supper. God, I thank you for your wonderful plan for sex and gender, and for your gifts of life and marriage. God, I thank you that I believe your Word to be true. God, I thank you!"

Yes, thank God, and treasure his Truth and Teaching. Treasure them, not because they are "your truth" or "mom's truth" or "dad's truth." Treasure them, not because they are "Lutheran truth." Treasure them because they are God's truth.

I'll say it again: thank God, and treasure his Truth and Teaching. Treasure them not just because they are right. Treasure them because they are pieces of the wonderful puzzle God has designed, the wonderful puzzle God is putting together, the wonderful puzzle that sets you right for life with God for time and for eternity.

I'll say it yet again: thank God, and treasure his Truth and Teaching. Treasure them, not with the heart of the Pharisee, proud of self - "God, I thank you that I'm not like those other people" Treasure them with the heart of Isaiah who saw God and shuddered: "Woe to me! I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty."

Treasure them with the heart of the tax collector. He didn't have his eyes on anybody else and how they were wrong. No, he saw his own wrong and his desperate need for mercy - "God, have mercy on me a sinner."

Treasure them with the heart of John Newton. You know John; he wrote "Amazing Grace." But first, he was a slave in Africa, then a slave trader of Africans, a captain of slave ships, and then an investor in the slave trade. As God's amazing grace impressed itself more and more on Newton's heart, the more he grew opposed to slavery. But that's another story; the reason I mention John Newton is for this story. One night he and a friend were walking the streets of London. They passed by drunks and drug addicts, poor and homeless. Newton's companion had some grace-less things to say about them. Newton knew grace: "There but for the grace of God go I."

"There but for the grace of God go I." I sometimes wonder something like this: what if I were born in North Chicago instead of Michigan? What if I were the son of a presbyterian pastor instead of Lutheran pastor? What if I would have gone to Northwestern University and the Methodist seminary there instead of Northwestern College and our seminary in Mequon? Would I know any of this [Bible]? Would I believe any of this [Bible]? But before all time, God knew me and God knew you, and thinking of Jesus, he chose me and he chose you to be his. Now, in time, God worked history to put us in the right place at the right time with the right people in our lives, so that we know this and we believe this. I can't claim any credit; it's not my good thinking that had me born and surrounded with Jesus. I'll say it again: I can't claim any credit; it's not my smarts that has me believing what God says. I can't claim any credit; so we treasure God's truth with humble thanks: "there but for the grace of God go I."

And so we treasure God's truth with the heart of Paul. "**Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the worst.**" You may know what Paul had in his history. There was a time he rejected Christ and his Church, a time Paul hunted down Christians to have them persecuted, arrested, even killed. Paul was out to crush Christ's church. We might not have that same history, but how many times, how many ways have we rejected Jesus - even

when we knew better? How many times, how many ways, have we done something, said something ... that hurt, maybe even crushed, somebody in their walk with Jesus? How far back in our history would God have to go to have us begging: "God, have mercy on me a sinner"?

In his grace, God showed Paul, and he shows us, the grace he has for us in Jesus. In Jesus, we don't have a God prosecuting us, looking to show us our sin and guilt, and condemn us for our crimes against God and each other. No, in Jesus, we have a God pointing us to Jesus and the cross. There in Jesus, there on the cross, all your sins against God, all your sins against each other - all of them are covered, canceled, paid for, and forgiven. With Jesus, we can echo Paul and confess: "Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the worst." Paul couldn't stop there. He goes on: "But for that very reason I was shown mercy so that in me, the worst of sinners, Christ Jesus might display his unlimited patience as an example for those who would believe on him and receive eternal life. Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen."

Paul just gushes - doesn't he? - about forgiveness and the mercy and grace of God in Jesus. But Paul doesn't stop there, does he? Because he treasured God's forgiveness and mercy and grace in Jesus, what else did Paul treasure? He treasured the whole truth of God's Word. He treasured the whole truth with a determination to know it better and better. He treasured the whole truth with a determination to share it more and more. And he treasured God's truth - God's whole truth - with a determination to protect it from false teachers.

When Hymenaeus and Alexander left the faith for false teaching, Paul excommunicated them, handed them over to Satan. When others taught false doctrine, you heard how Paul gave Timothy clear directions to "command" them to stop.

Why? Look what false teaching does. With their false teachings, Hymenaeus and Alexander shipwrecked, smashed, sunk their own faith. And the other false teachers were on their way to do much the same. And worse. They were distracting the church with made-up meaningless talk, distracting the church from Jesus and the faith that saves.

So why was Paul so determined to protect the church from false teaching? What was his goal? Not to exercise control, but to show love. Not to protect turf, but to protect the glory of God's truth, the truth that gives faith and live. And - get this - Paul's goal wasn't just to silence false teachers with their false teaching, but to win them back to the truth.

That could take us back to last week's sermon - "**Make every effort** to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." It could take us back two weeks - Jesus hurting for those who wouldn't listen to him. But mostly it takes us back to grace - the grace that God is showing and sharing with us, the grace that God gives us to show and share with others. So treasure God's grace, and treasure God's Truth. Amen.

SECOND READING

1 Timothy 1

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Savior and of Christ Jesus our hope,

To Timothy my true son in the faith:

Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

As I urged you when I went into Macedonia, stay there in Ephesus so that you may command certain people not to teach false doctrines any longer or to devote themselves to myths and endless genealogies. Such things promote controversial speculations rather than advancing God's work which is by faith. The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith. Some have departed from these and have turned to meaningless talk.

They want to be teachers of the law, but they do not know what they are talking about or what they so confidently affirm.

We know that the law is good if one uses it properly. We also know that the law is made not for the righteous but for lawbreakers and rebels, the ungodly and sinful, the unholy and irreligious, for those who kill their fathers or mothers, for murderers, for the sexually immoral, for those practicing homosexuality, for slave traders and liars and perjurers—and for whatever else is contrary to the sound doctrine that conforms to the gospel concerning the glory of the blessed God, which he entrusted to me.

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, that he considered me trustworthy, appointing me to his service. Even though I was once a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent man, I was shown mercy because I acted in ignorance and unbelief. The grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst. But for that very reason I was shown mercy so that in me, the worst of sinners, Christ Jesus might display his immense patience as an example for those who would believe in him and receive eternal life. Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Timothy, my son, I am giving you this command in keeping with the prophecies once made about you, so that by recalling them you may fight the battle well, holding on to faith and a good conscience, which some have rejected and so have suffered shipwreck with regard to the faith. Among them are Hymenaeus and Alexander, whom I have handed over to Satan to be taught not to blaspheme.

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

NICENE CREED
