Sermon followed by Service

May 29, 2022

Revelation 21:9-23

Rome. Egypt. Germany. Great Britain. The Colorado Wilderness. Colorado Fourteeners. Guidebooks for places I've been. Guidebooks for places I'd like to go. Guide books for places I'll never get to. I like this guidebook because it tells me how to get there. I like these guide books because they have pictures - magnificent, amazing, glorious, inspiring pictures.

This past week we've seen some pictures we wish we could un-see, haven't we? Pictures of death and destruction from Ukraine. Heart-breaking pictures of starving children, deformed children. Pictures of destruction from fire and tornadoes. Pictures that make us feel sick inside with the school shooting in Texas.

Today Jesus gives us a picture of a time and place, a life with no death or destruction, no hurt or heartache, no sickness in body or mind. A time and place, a life with no fear or worry, no gut-churning. A time and place where all the tears have already been wiped away and you will never-ever have another tear of pain or sadness.

Today Jesus gives us a picture of a time and place more magnificent, more glorious, more awesome, more inspiring than the most magnificent cathedral in Europe or the most awesome mountain-top view. And this picture that Jesus gives us doesn't go on the pile of "shoulda, coulda, woulda when I was younger." It doesn't go on the pile of "out of our budget." It doesn't go on the pile of forgotten favorites from the past. No this picture that Jesus gives us is a time and a place, a life that Jesus has for us, for you - not "if you pay," but already "paid," because Jesus paid with his death on the cross. It's a time and a place, a life that Jesus has for us, for you - not "if you're good enough," or "because you're good enough," but because you have Jesus, because you have Jesus covering you with his goodness, so that God sees you not just as "good enough," but with Jesus and his life, God sees you as right by him and right for heaven. The picture that Jesus shows us today is of a time and place, a life that God has for you, and for all who believe in his gospel promise with Jesus. If you have any doubts about that being you, let's talk.

Today Jesus gives us a guidebook picture of heaven. And what's the first thing we see? The glory of God. Before we see any saints or angels, before we notice the pearly gates or the streets of gold, we see the glory of God. Our guidebook tells us: **"It shone with the glory of God; her source of light was like a very precious jewel, like jasper, clear as crystal**." Later we're told, **"The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp**." No sun, no moon, and yet the city sparkles with light. How? Why? The glory of the Lord – back with the Exodus when god delivered his people out of Egypt, the bright light in the pillar of fire that showed God's presence with his people; later, the light that filled the tabernacle and then the temple when God made his home there; the glory of God's holiness that would blind and burn any sinner; the glory of God's Christmas love; then on the Mount of Transfiguration, light of the saving Lamb who shone brighter than lightning and whiter than snow. God's church in heaven shines bright with the glory of God. Why? Because it is the home of God.

What kind of home does God have? It's a home jeweled for kings and royalty. Now if this were some European cathedral or palace, the guide book might point us to some dark, cold monastery where the priests lived, or some row of shacks where the slaves and servants lived. But one of the most beautiful, impressive, and glorious things about the home of God, God's church in heaven, is that God's home is also the home of God's people. Those whose names are written in the book of life. Those who have been washed clean of their sin in the blood of the Lamb. Those who overcome the temptations of this world and remain faithful to the end. God's home in heaven is their home.

Picture some of the people living there. Poor Lazarus, who used to live off the crumbs that fell from the rich man's table, his sores licked by dogs, he is now living in a city of gold and jewels; and it's his home! The martyr Stephen who was killed for his faith, and saw a vision of Jesus at the right hand of God before he died, now he lives with God. The thief who died on the cross next to Jesus, is now alive with Jesus in Paradise. People going through life in this world as lost - Jesus came to find them and take them home. People sick with sin - Jesus came to heal them and take them home. People used and abused - Jesus came to comfort them and take them home. The guilty - Jesus came to forgive them and take them home. The lonely, the hurting, the unloved and unlovable, Jesus came to take them home, to make his home to be our home.

In that Holy City, the poor won't live in the wrong part of town, the hurting won't be forgotten and alone, the unlovable won't be shunned off to the side. That old order of things won't be in God's house. In that city of gold, the poor will no longer be poor. The hurting will have their tears wiped away, never to hurt again. And the lonely and unloved will be loved. By God himself, with God himself.

Did you notice? In heaven, the home of God, there is no house of God, no temple, no church. Why not? "Because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple." Because God is right there with his people, because Jesus the Lamb is right there face to face with his people. In God's City, God's people don't need a special place to go to see God or hear God or worship God. Instead of going to church and seeing a picture or a statue of Jesus, in the church of heaven, God's people see the Lord himself smiling, making his face shine on his us, right there in front of us. Instead of going to church and hearing a pastor, God's people hear the word of Jesus direct from his smile: "I love you; I've got you; and you've got me!" Can you imagine hearing his voice? ... seeing his smile? Some day we won't have to imagine, but we will see with our own eyes and hear with our own ears. Why? Because we will be living with God. In the church of heaven, God's home is also the home of God's people.

If we're going to finish our tour on time we better move along. We could talk about the walls - impressive in size, glorious with gems and jewels - showing off the glory of God, showing off the safety and security of his people. But let me jump ahead to say something about the gates - they're open with the riches of the world flowing in! In heaven, we won't be under siege. In heaven, we won't be suffering supply chain shortages. In heaven, we won't have to lock the doors at night. In heaven, with God, there will be no danger, no trouble, no evil - nothing to worry about, nothing to fear. In heaven, we will be perfectly safe in the light of Jesus.

Sounds good, doesn't it? I know I don't deserve to live in a house like that. I've caused too much hurt and heartache to be let into heaven. I've shamed God, fought God too much to be thought a child of God worthy of the home of God. That's not just me, is it? That's each and every one of us. And yet, I get to think of heaven as my home, and I get to show you heaven as your home. Why? In your baptism God put his name on you, washed you clean, covered you with Christ, made you alive as his child - a child of God fit for the home of God. To you, God gives his new covenant promise – "I will be your God and you will be my people; I will forgive your sins and remember your wickedness no more." To you, Jesus says, "Because I live you also will live." And to you, he gives his promise, "I will come back and take you to be with me that you may be where I **am.**" As today's tour comes to an end, you get to know this - that house, God's house, is built for you. Amen.

FIRST READING

Acts 1:1–11

In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.

On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about.

For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."


Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

SECOND READING

Revelation 21:9–11, 22–

27

One of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues came and said to me, "Come, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb." And he carried me away in the Spirit to a mountain great and high, and showed me the Holy City, Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God. It shone with the glory of God, and its brilliance was like that of a very precious jewel, like a jasper, clear as crystal.

I did not see a temple in the city, because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their splendor into it. On no day will its gates ever be shut, for there will be no night there. The glory and honor of the nations will be brought into it. Nothing impure will ever enter it, nor will anyone who does what is shameful or deceitful, but only those whose names are written in the Lamb's book of life.

NICENE CREED
