2 Samuel 11

List 5 of the greatest heros in the Bible. List 5 of the biggest disappointments in the Bible. Who is on both lists? David. Today we see one of the reasons he makes the biggest disappointment list.

We fast-forward. David's no longer a man on the run, hiding here, hiding there, hiding out in the back of caves; now David is resting easy in the palace of the king. That's right; he's not longer being chased by King Saul, he's replaced King Saul and become king himself. As king, life is good for David and the people of Israel. Israel's no longer under attack fighting for its national survival; instead, David's taking the fight to their neighbors, expanding their borders. At least that's the way it used to be. Now, at the time of our lesson, David's living the life of a king who thinks he has it made. He's living in a palace built with cedar imported from Lebanon. He's taken more wives than I can name. And instead of leading his army out to war, while his army is out in the field, David's living the palace life. The hero has become a home-body taking life easy.

Taking. Instead of taking seriously his role with God, he's taking life easy. Instead of taking seriously his role for his family, he's taking life easy. Instead of taking seriously his role for his people, he's taking life easy. I'm not saying that David was taking a vacation from all his duties; he could have been busy in the morning doing this and doing that. But instead of taking the role, the mission, the life that God had for him, David was taking it easy.

Taking. Taking a walk on his roof-top patio. Taking in the sights of his beautiful city, Jerusalem. Taking in the sights of his

beautiful neighbor washing herself. He sends to find out who she is. "Isn't she Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam, the wife of Uriah?" Even if David didn't know Bathsheba, he knew those people: Eliam was a somebody; Uriah was one of his special forces soldiers. But that didn't stop David. David had become used to taking. He sends his messengers to take Bathsheba and to bring her to him. And then he ... enough said.

Or is it enough said? People want to make Bathsheba into an exhibitionist, a manipulator of a king too weak to control himself. People want to make David and Bathsheba into victims of forbidden love or maybe just lust. But there is nothing in our lesson - or the rest of Scripture - that points to Bathsheba as guilty. Instead, David sends to take her. And to cover up his guilt, David sends for her husband Uriah. And when that doesn't work, David sends his faithful soldier Uriah back to the battle lines with David's handwritten orders to have Uriah killed by the enemy.

What had happened to David?

Was it the pressure of being king? Too many expectations, too much to do, too many people wanting answers? Was he feeling restless, overwhelmed, needing to needing to flex some muscle to feel good about himself?

Or was he feeling entitled, spoiled? As a warrior, he was a success. As a king, he was a success. He had heard his people cheering him. He had heard neighboring kings surrender to him, or seek to partner with him. Why? He was specially chosen by God; he was specially blessed by God. So, had success so gone to David's head that he was used to having his way and taking what he wanted? Was he so in love with his success and power ... was he so deceived

by his success and power ... was he so taken in by his success and power that he thought he could do whatever he wanted?

Pressure, power, success. Pressure can be a blessing that God uses to forge us. Power can be a blessing that God uses to accomplish his will. Success can be a blessing that God gives us to set us up to be a blessing to others. Pressure, power, success - do you see how God has used, or is using, those powers to bless you - to be a blessing for others? I can see that in you. Now, if we lose our focus - those same forces - pressure, power, success - can all be forces the devil uses to distract us from God. I imagine we've all seen that too, especially in other people. How about for yourself? When you are under pressure, when you're in power, when you're enjoying success - how does the devil use that pressure, that power, that success to distract you from the life God has for you? Pressure, power, success - they all have their dangers, don't they?

Or was it something as simple as this? Idle hands are the devil's workshop. When you step back from work, who do your hands and minds get busy with? The God who created you and designed you for his purpose? Or when you have free time, do you find Satan and his world out there distracting you away from God? It can be a good thing to be busy with God.

Back to our lesson - David and Bathsheba. So how did it work out? By the end of the chapter, David had a new wife, a new son, and Uriah was out of the picture. It looked like David might have gotten away with it. Except we're told: "But the thing David had done displeased the LORD."

Next week, we'll look at what that meant for David and for us. This week, I want to fast-forward again, to the New Testament. Scan

through the New Testament and what do we see of our lesson? Only that Bathsheba was Uriah's wife. What do we see of what David did to Bathsheba? Nothing. What do we see of David and Bathsheba together? Only this, that both David and Bathsheba are listed in the line of our Savior. And we hear our Savior again and again called: "The Son of David."

Let me back up to a question I just asked and answered. "What do we see of what David did to Bathsheba? Nothing." Some see that silence as a sign of male privilege, and the Bible's disregard for victims, a failure of justice. David and the Apostle Paul see that silence as a sign of God's grace. "Blessed are they whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the one whose sin the Lord will never count against him." That's too good to just hear once. "Blessed are they whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the one whose sin the Lord will never count against him." Look throughout the New Testament and what do we see of David? God doesn't identify David by his worst moment. Let me say that again too - God doesn't identify David by his worst moment.

Isn't that great?! It doesn't always feel great, does it? There are times we want to see more punitive, punishing justice - the bully bullied, the abuser abused, the scammer scammed, the cheater cheated, the taker took, the killer killed, the guilty canceled. Instead, our God works - and offers - another kind of justice, he cancels guilt. Not just with a wave of his hand, but with a stretch of his arms. With a stretch of his arms, Jesus put himself in the place of the taker, the liar, the cheater, the entitled, the spoiled, the killer. With a stretch of his arms, on the cross and all the way to the cross, Jesus put himself in my place and yours. What does that get to mean for us? With Jesus, God sees your guilt gone. It gets better - baptized into Jesus, God sees

you covered with Jesus - covered with a perfect life busy for God and busy with God. Baptized into Jesus, God sees you covered with Jesus, living a life of caring for others instead of just taking for self. He sees you covered with Jesus, living a life where pressure, power, and success all work blessing. With Jesus, that's how God sees you ... all the way to heaven!

Isn't it great God doesn't identify us - me, you - by our worst moments? Amen.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

FIRST READING

2 Samuel 11:1-17, 26-27

In the spring, at the time when kings go off to war, David sent Joab out with the king's men and the whole Israelite army. They destroyed the Ammonites and besieged Rabbah. But David remained in Jerusalem.

One evening David got up from his bed and walked around on the roof of the palace. From the roof he saw a woman bathing. The woman was very beautiful, and David sent someone to find out about her. The man said, "She is Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam and the wife of Uriah the Hittite." Then David sent messengers to get her. She came to him, and he slept with her. (Now she was purifying herself from her monthly uncleanness.) Then she went back home. The woman conceived and sent word to David, saying, "I am pregnant."

So David sent this word to Joab: "Send me Uriah the Hittite." And Joab sent him to David. When Uriah came to him, David asked him how Joab was, how the soldiers were and how the war was going. Then David said to Uriah, "Go down to your house and wash your feet."

So Uriah left the palace, and a gift from the king was sent after him. But Uriah slept at the entrance to the palace with all his master's servants and did not go down to his house.

David was told, "Uriah did not go home." So he asked Uriah, "Haven't you just come from a military campaign? Why didn't you go home?"

Uriah said to David, "The ark and Israel and Judah are staying in tents, and my commander Joab and my lord's men are camped in the open country. How could I go to my house to eat and drink and make love to my wife? As surely as you live, I will not do such a thing!"

Then David said to him, "Stay here one more day, and tomorrow I will send you back." So Uriah remained in Jerusalem that day and the next. At David's invitation, he ate and drank with him, and David made him drunk. But in the evening Uriah went out to sleep on his mat among his master's servants; he did not go home.


In the morning David wrote a letter to Joab and sent it with Uriah. In it he wrote, "Put Uriah out in front where the fighting is fiercest. Then withdraw from him so he will be struck down and die."

So while Joab had the city under siege, he put Uriah at a place where he knew the strongest defenders were. When the men of the city came out and fought against Joab, some of the men in David's army fell; moreover, Uriah the Hittite died.

When Uriah's wife heard that her husband was dead, she mourned for him. After the time of mourning was over, David had her brought to his house, and she became his wife and bore him a son. But the thing David had done displeased the LORD.

Let us pray.




LORD'S PRAYER






