"Have you seen my keys? Where's my wallet? Who took the checkbook? I'm missing a sock." Sound familiar? When something is lost, what do you do? Maybe you backtrack, working your way back to where you last had it. Maybe you work your search grid starting in one corner of the house, looking through everything, behind everything, under everything before you move on to the next spot. Maybe your favorite way to search is to shout: "Help! I can't find my ______." And then you run around like a chicken with its head cut off until you get stuck in front of the TV or the refrigerator.

After a while, after getting good and mad at the world for the way it keeps on losing your stuff ... after a while you might think: "It'll show up. I've got a spare. I guess I'll have to wear one of yesterday's socks." And we go on until we really need it. But what if what is missing is a child, your child? For a while we might think: "He'll show up." I hope we don't think: "I've got others." No. We hunt. We search. We call. We text. We do whatever it takes. We are going to find the lost no matter what it takes, no matter how long it takes, no matter how inconvenient it is. We are going to leave no stone unturned to find the lost.

That's what we see in our lesson - the shepherd searching for his lost sheep. He doesn't just wait. He doesn't just make a couple calls. He searches. He searches in the thickets and thorns and gets all torn up. He searches in the marsh, in the muck and the mire, and gets all mucked up. He searches like that sheep is helpless to find its way back. He searches like if he doesn't find that sheep it will die a most awful death, and part of him will die with that sheep.

And then there's the woman searching for her lost coin. The shepherd might blame the sheep and give up. But you can't blame a coin. So she goes on a mission. She looks under the bed and between the sheets. She checks every pocket and the bottom of the washer and the dryer, too. She checks every place she can think of ... and she checks every place else, until she finds her coin.

With the woman, with the shepherd, there's no settling for: "It'll show up sooner or later." There's no thinking: "I've got others. There's more where that came from." There's no: "Is it really worth it?" That woman, that shepherd are determined to find the lost no matter what it takes, no matter how long it takes.

That's God searching for his lost child. The drifting child who wanders off without knowing it, without knowing the danger he's in. The fighting child who goes off to do his own thing and don't anybody get in the way. That's God searching for his child - the hurting child who goes off to find some healing who knows where. Our lesson shows us God searching for his lost child, God searching for you and for me, so that we don't go from lost in this world to lost from God forever in hell.

When Jesus sees the lost ... when he saw you lost, he didn't think: "Oh, I've got others." No, he's thinking: "I died for him, for her, for you." He's seen you from before all time. You've been on his heart from before all time. He sees you and his cross, you and the life he gave for you, you and the death he died for you. He sees you and how he set you right for life with God. So when his lost children are difficult, he doesn't just think: "Oh, it's their own fault." He's thinking: "I've got what they need. I have the love they need, the forgiveness they need. I've just got to find them." When he sees how messed up the lost can be, he doesn't think: "Oh, they won't fit in

anymore, not after what they've done, the places they've been." No, Jesus is thinking: "I've got a place for them, a heart for them. I've got a place and a heart for you, a place in heaven for you."

And when the lost are found, then what? The woman with the lost coin, the shepherd with the lost sheep ... when they find the lost, then what? They call together their friends and neighbors: "**Rejoice** with me! I have found what was lost." And when God finds the lost? The heavens rejoice!

When you were first baptized, the heavens rejoiced! When you first sang, "I am Jesus' little lamb," the heavens rejoiced! When you came back after that wandering spell, when you came back after your fight against God, when you came back for God's healing, the heavens rejoiced!

And when God found that other little lamb - the one who doesn't look like we look ... when God found that other little lamb - the one with the wrong politics ... when God found that other little lamb - the one with the messed up family ... when God found that other little lamb - the one who doesn't say much or that one who says too much ... when God found that other little lamb ... what did the heavens do?

The heavens didn't mutter: "It's about time." The heavens didn't wonder how those people or you people could fit in with them in heaven. The heavens rejoice! The heavens rejoice every time we're found. The heavens rejoice every time we turn to Jesus for forgiveness. The heavens rejoice every time they see us or hear us together with Jesus.

And what about us? We live in a world that loves to boo and complain like the Pharisees in our lesson. Somehow it makes us feel better about ourselves. If that's what we want to do in church, we can find plenty of reasons ... we can find plenty of people to boo and complain about in any church. But let me tell you: it's not a sign of genius to boo and complain. And to think that we're better than someone else ... that's not proof that we're right. The Pharisees thought they were the geniuses in the room; they thought they were the right ones in the room. They thought heaven should have been cheering over them. Instead heaven cheers over the lost who are found.

We get to be part of that cheering. We get to share that cheering. How do we do that? How do you show the people around you that heaven cheers to see them with Jesus? How do you show that stranger, that visitor in church, that heaven cheers to see them with Jesus? How do you show that quiet one, who doesn't talk with anybody ... how do you show them that heaven cheers to see them with Jesus? How do you show that child, that teen, that parent with the crying baby ... how do you show them that heaven cheers to see them with Jesus?

Today heaven is cheering over you because God worked history, he moved heaven and earth to find you. Whom do you know who needs to be found? Who do you know who needs to hear that heaven is cheering to see them with Jesus? Amen.

THE SERVICE

IN OUR WORLD TODAY... do we fix or toss out? If we lose something, do we look and find, or just buy new? We live in such a throw-away, just get new world that we sometimes might think of people that same way.

IN OUR WORSHIP TODAY ... we see how Jesus sees you and me and each and every individual as precious. So precious he gave himself up to save us, so precious he turns the history of the world to find us. What in our life are we willing to sacrifice, what are we willing to turn over for the sake of a lost soul?

FIRST READING Hosea 3


