Book Report Choices

- 1. **Write a Summary-** Write a one page summary about the book. The summary should tell me enough about the book that I know what the book is about and what the characters are like.
- 2. **Diorama-** Create a scene from the story using figures or toys. The scene should be a memorable one that captures the story.
- 3. **New Ending-** Write your own ending to the story changing how the actual story ended. An example would be changing the ending to "The Three Little Pigs" to the Big Bad Wolf actually blowing the brick house down.
- 4. **Mobile** Draw important characters or items from the story and make a mobile out of them. It needs to be able to hang when you are finished with it.
- 5. **Brochure-** Make a travel brochure for a place in the book. Remember you are trying to get people to come to this place.
- 6. **Book Jacket-** Design a new book cover for the book. The book cover should have a scene from the book but not give away what happens in the book. They are trying to pique the interest of the readers and get them to read the book.
- 7. **Letter to the Author-** Write a friendly letter to the author of the book. Be sure to include all the parts of a friendly letter including the date, greeting, body, closing, and signature. In the body of your letter include the following items: the name of the book you read, your opinion of the book, your favorite part of the book and why it is your favorite part, and at least two questions for the author.
- 8. **Dress-Up-** Dress up as a character in the book you read. Tell the class about the book from the character's point of view- as if the story really happened to you.
- 9. **Newspaper** Make a newspaper article about the book. Give your article a title related to the book. In your article include facts you learned about the topic. Make sure you tell the title, author, and illustrator and your opinion or the book in your article. Your article should also include a picture.
- 10. **Oral Presentation** Bring the book to school. Tell the class the title, author, and illustrator. Describe the main character(s). Summarize the story. Tell the class about your favorite part. Tell if you would/would not recommend this book. (Note cards may be used for help.)
