BIBLE- Jesus Changes Zacchaeus' Life

THIS WEEK- This week we learned about the letter G. We worked on finding “what happens next” using sequence cards. The children also learned by combining objects and separating objects to come up with different total numbers. We talked about tornadoes, hurricanes, and storms. The children learned wind is associated with these weather types and knows what type of clouds show up for this type of weather. I also made a tornado in a jar so they could visually see what a tornado does and looks like.

NEXT WEEK- This is the last section we have in the Investigators Club curriculum. In this section they will be learning about seasons, what they are called, what you may see and what happens in these seasons. We will talk about our favorite season and what fun activities they do in that season. We will talk about weather and why it is important to know the weather for that day. We will be learning our last 2 letters K and X and will be reviewing numbers 0-10. I will also read a classic story “The Wind and the Sun” and we will have a small project to go along with the story.
